INFORMATION FOR DOG OWNERS

We welcome you and your dog to Coraki Holiday Cottages and are delighted that you have chosen to stay with us for your relaxing getaway. To ensure that we maintain our high standard of tidiness and hygiene, we would ask that you please be aware of the following:-

- Prior to your arrival to Coraki, we would ask that you bring any necessary dog bedding/bowls/towels/blankets etc. with you.
- A one-off fee of \$15.00/dog applies to guests with dogs.
- While we are happy for your dog to be inside the cottage/villa with you, we must insist that they be kept out of the bedroom areas and off all furniture and soft furnishings.
- Should it be found that your dog/s have been on bedding/furniture, guests will be charged for additional cleaning & drycleaning
- We allow a maximum of two dogs per cottage/villa with the exception of the Albany Dog Show weekends when dogs must be housed in their own caravans or trailers.
- Please make sure that your dog is up to date with his/her vaccinations.
- We must ask that your dog be on a lead and under control at all times when within our grounds, due to other guests and their dogs and for the safety of the wildlife that exists within our grounds.
- Dogs can become very anxious when left alone in an unfamiliar environment. Please do not leave your dog unattended during your stay. Please take your dog with you or make alternative arrangements for a dog minder (Ulster Road Kennels – ph: 9841 1181 or BordaBeMyn Pet Care – ph: 98464306).
- In order to maintain our grounds for other guests, please be responsible for cleaning up after your dog.
- You are free to exercise your dog off the lead on the shoreline in front of Coraki and there is a bush track in front of our property, which is great for walking your dog.
- Dog friendly beaches are located at Ledge Beach/Gull Rock Point/Nanarup Beach, all within a 10 – 15 minute drive from Coraki. The stretch of beach at the Griffiths Street turnoff, in between Middleton & Emu Point is also dog friendly.
- All dogs must be completely towelled down and dried before entering our cottages/villas.
- The majority of our coastline falls within National Parks and it is therefore an offence to take dogs into these areas. Please be aware that on the spot fines may be issued by the ranger.

We would like to continue to offer a holiday place for you and your dog and we therefore trust that you will understand our need to have these guidelines in place.
